➤ DEFINITION OF 'LINE OF FIRE'


'Line of Fire' refers to a situation where a person is in harm's way, either by being directly in the path of a moving object or hazard, or by being struck by released energy, resulting in serious injury or death.

➤ MAJOR CATEGORIES OF 'LINE OF FIRE' HAZARDS

Striking Hazard: Being hit by falling objects or by moving vehicles.



Crushing Hazard: Body parts get caught in, on or between two objects.



Stored Energy Hazard: Unexpected released of hazardous stored energy.



PREVENTION OF 'LINE OF FIRE' HAZARDS



Conduct daily safety inspections on equipment to prevent sudden failures



Listen to and engage in toolbox talks when they are being conducted.



Attend the necessary training before using heavy machinery



Follow all safety procedures.



Always be aware of your surroundings and identify potential hazards.



Follow proper machinery operating procedures.



Report any potential hazard to authorized personnel.



Dispose of broken equipment, parts, and assets properly.



Wear the proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
