Maintain cleanliness in the office, classroom, laboratory and workshop at all times.



Wear appropriate PPE when performing practicals.



Safe Road Crossing

- Use designated pedestrian crossings.
- Look both ways before crossing.



Observe Speed Limits

- Slow down within IBTE areas.
- Watch out for pedestrians.



Use Handrails on Stairs

- Walk carefully and do not rush.
- Refrain from using phones while on the stairs
