- Encourage the active participation of teacher trainees in academic activities to enhance creative and innovative thinking;
- Increase the visibility of teacher trainee excellence and motivate other teacher trainees to perform better thereby upgrading standards of excellence and achievement.

To be eligible for the award, a teacher trainee need to meet the following criteria:

- Successfully completed the programme
- Determines excellent attitude and discipline, motivated and has never been subjected to any form of disciplinary action throughout his/her programme
- Scores minimum GPA of 4.0 (for FTE programme) or CGPA of 4.0 (for DTE and CTE programme)
- Achieves the Minimum Total Final Points scored of 80%

IBTE BEST STUDENT AWARD

The IBTE Best Student Award is awarded to an individual student who has distinguished themselves both academically and in their outstanding involvement in extra curricular / co-curricular activities.

Students at all programme levels are eligible for nomination for the IBTE Best Student Award. The two network of schools, IBTE Central and IBTE Satellite, will nominate ONE best student who has met all the criteria for the BEST Student Award for each level of qualification in each programme cluster at any one time. These nominations will be made through the IBTE Central and IBTE Satellite Academic Board respectively, to the IBTE Academic Council Secretariat.

IBTE Student Special Award was originally created in 2014 as recognition to students who have demonstrated outstanding performance and participation in extracurricular activities, leadership in school and academic achievement. This award is aimed to promote students leadership skills and development and enriching the lives of students and the school.






